
ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT



DISCIPLINES

Ours is a multidisciplinary department wherein much interdisciplinary work is carried out. Our core areas are:

Anthropology & Sociology	The thrust of our pedagogical practice focuses on ethnographic research and theoretical frameworks emerging from the global South. Courses offered by the faculty include Media and Development, Medical Anthropology, Anthropology of Reproduction, Contemporary India and Environment and Society. Research areas include popular culture, heritage, infertility, reproductive health, sexuality, technology studies and climate change.
Cognitive Science	Cognitive Science at LA encompasses a multidisciplinary research ecosystem that involves incorporating techniques from diverse fields such as Psychology, Linguistics, Neuroscience, Computer Science, Computational Biology, and engineering. Our overarching goal is to establish cutting-edge research infrastructure capable of comprehensively understanding cognitive functions and fostering the development of theoretical models and transnational protocols. Research areas include sensorimotor learning, memory, emotion, mathematical/formal models of human language and cognition, biolinguistics, and psycholinguistics.
Cultural Studies	Cultural Studies critically examines questions related to culture and society while insisting on the fluidity and negotiability of these categories. Because Cultural Studies is essentially a hybrid discipline, students are also introduced to other related subjects like Sociology, Anthropology, History, Literature (English and/or Vernacular), Gender Studies etc. Current research and teaching interests include films, LGBTQ rights, evolution of gender questions under colonial India, community and law etc.
Development Studies	Development Studies is a diverse and multidisciplinary space. Research interests of core faculty include migration and development, women, gender and development, village and longitudinal studies; sociology and social history of labour, inequality, caste, and public policy; applied micro econometrics in the fields of health, education, gender, labour market outcomes, environmental justice, biodiversity conservation, and climate change.
Economics	The discipline of economics has been at the forefront for creating an environment for both rigorous teaching and research particularly by emphasizing on application oriented and impactful research. Faculty and PhD researchers are engaged in a diverse range of issues related to economic growth, international economics, monetary economics, labour economics, development economics and industrial economics. The Minor Economics programme is a popular choice among undergraduates majoring in Engineering.


English Literature	Research interests include contemporary and multi-ethnic American fiction, American women's writing, literary theory, gender and body studies, twentieth and twenty-first century poetry and poetics, literature and the visual arts, literature and philosophy, the gift in literature, manuscript studies, digital humanities, post secular theory, nineteenth-century literature and culture, queer studies, postcolonial studies, thing theory, diaspora studies, graphic novels, popular literature, South Asian Literature, intersectionality, and feminist Standpoint Theory.
Linguistics	Linguistics has been innovating on research in the frontier areas of theoretical and experimental linguistics spanning studies on syntax, semantics, phonology/phonetics, language acquisition, computational linguistics, and psycholinguistics. We explore natural language from formal/mathematical, biological, computational and psychological perspectives that lead invariably to interdisciplinary inquiries addressing fields as varied as psychology, neuroscience, philosophy, anthropology, computer science, and cognitive science in general.
Psychology	The diverse interests of Psychology at LA include: positive psychology with an emphasis on resilience; organizational behaviour and work psychology focusing on cross-cultural virtual teams; teacher leadership, helping behaviour, eco friendly behaviours, and ethical decision-making in the workplace; critical and qualitative studies on mental health, culture, disability and gender; and chronic illness management with a focus on psycho-oncology, endocrinology, chronic kidney disease and women's health; cultural aspects of health behaviour change with a focus on diet, exercise and safe sex.

The Career Counseling and Outreach Program organized by the Department of Liberal Arts at IIT Hyderabad on January 12, 2025, aimed to bridge the career guidance gap for students from Kandi village and nearby areas. Coordinated by Dr. Anindita Majumdar and the HoD, Dr. Srirupa Chatterjee, a total of 57 students from six Zila Parishad High Schools (ZPHS) participated in the event. The event introduced the school children to diverse career opportunities, particularly in the social sciences. The program encouraged students to explore disciplines like sociology, psychology, economics, political science, and history, emphasizing their importance in addressing modern challenges beyond the traditional focus on medicine and engineering. Students received guidance on higher education pathways, including universities, entrance exams, and scholarships, as well as career opportunities ranging from teaching and government jobs to emerging fields like policy-making, content creation, and CSR. The program also highlighted how social sciences provide a strong foundation for competitive exams like UPSC and state public service commission exams. Delivered in both English and Telugu, the program reflected IIT Hyderabad's commitment to empowering rural youth by expanding their horizons and equipping them with the tools to achieve their aspirations.



PH.D SEMINAR SERIES





Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) System

TMS is a noninvasive procedure that uses magnetic fields to stimulate neurons in the cortical brain areas. TMS can be used to inhibit or excite brain regions to assess their causal role in a cognitive process




Electromyogram (EMG)

Two-channel EMG records muscle activity and Motor evoked Potential (MEP) in response to magnetic stimulation to measure cortical excitability



Nerve Stimulator

Nerve Stimulator is used for the peripheral nerve stimulation and measure the Sensory Evoked Potentials (SEP)



Electroencephalogram (EEG)

EEG measures the electrical activity of the brain using active electrodes placed on scalp. Real-time EEG data analysis can be used for performing closed-loop TMS.excitability



Digitizing Tablet

Tablet is used to record the hand movement through the stylus in various motor learning tasks.



VR Frame Setup

Frame is used in combination with Digitizing Tablet to manipulate the visual information of hand position to induce various kinds of motor learning.



Consumer Pyramids Household Survey (CPUS).

A CPHS is a survey conducted by the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE) in India. It collects data on various aspects of households, including their income, expenditure, savings, employment, education, health, and demographics. The CPHS is known for its large sample size and longitudinal nature. It follows a panel design, where a representative sample of households is surveyed repeatedly over time. This allows researchers to track changes in household characteristics, consumption patterns, and economic outcomes over time.

Larynx Simulator

This is used to simulate the activity of the vocal cords so that it can be plugged in instead of electrodes in order to generate test signals.



High-Quality Electret

This is a condenser microphone for the recording of high-quality audio for speech analysis. Since electrets come with a permanent built-in charge and respond best to frequencies within the lowermiddle to high-frequency range, this microphone is well-suited to speech.






